- 120 credit points with at least 80 credit points at TASC Level 2 and above
- Everyday adult standard computers and the internet
- Everyday adult standard literacy
- Everyday adult standard numeracy
- Submit evidence of planning for future pathways at the end of Year 10.

TCE CREDIT POINTS

If you have not achieved 120 credit points, you can continue to add points in future years including through VET studies and TASC recognised courses.

If you need any of the three everyday adult standards you can sit a safety net test to achieve the standard. Please contact your school to arrange a test sitting.
