

FAQS FROM STUDENTS: YOUR RESULTS

<p>When do I get my results?</p>	<p>Your 2020 results are available from Thursday 17 December.</p> <p>Your results are emailed to you, if you have registered to receive results via email.</p> <p>Everyone is mailed their results via post (including if you register for emailed results). Mailing starts on Thursday 17 December.</p>
<p>Why didn't I get my results via email?</p>	<p>Note: Results are progressively emailed from the morning of 17 December, so you <u>may not</u> receive your results at exactly the same time as your classmates.</p> <p>You are emailed your results if you register using the form on the TASC website.</p> <p>TASC will keep email registration open for late registrations until 5pm on 22 December. You will be emailed your results within 24 hours of a late registration. (A late registration is registration after 16 December.)</p> <p>To register for emailed results, you need to complete both steps in the registration process:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. completing the registration form 2. clicking on the link that is emailed to you to verify that the email address provided is correct.
<p>Can I inspect my written exams?</p>	<p>Yes. You can inspect your written exams, including if you believe there may have been a process error. TASC does not remark written exams.</p> <p>Make an application to inspect your written exams using the Request for Inspection of Written Exams form.</p> <p>See Inspections of written exam material for more information.</p> <p>First round applications for inspections by Year 12 and 13 students close on 3 January 2021.</p>
<p>Can I get a copy of my written exams?</p>	<p>Yes. You can request a copy of your written exam material be returned to you using the Request for Copy of Written Exams form. Copies are provided in the first week of July and you must apply before the end of April in the year following your exam.</p> <p>If you just want to see the exam paper, all written exam papers are published online after exams finish. Go to the specific Course page and select "Supporting documents including external assessment material".</p>

<p>Some of the courses I studied do not show in my results. What can I do? (or I have a different query about my results?)</p>	<p>You can use the Results Queries form to raise specific issues or questions about your results.</p> <p>Include all necessary information about your query and the actions you would like TASC to take to help us provide a useful and prompt response.</p>
<p>I'm in Year 12 and didn't achieve my Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE). What can I do?</p>	<p>To achieve the TCE in 2020, you need to meet all five Standards:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Participation and Achievement Standard – 120 credit points (with at least 80 credit points at TASC Level 2 and above) 2. Everyday Adult Standard – Use of Computers and the Internet 3. Everyday Adult Standard – Reading, Writing and Communication (in English) 4. Everyday Adult Standard – Mathematics 5. Evidence of Planning for Future Pathway. <p>Need more TCE credit points? If you have not achieved 120 TCE credit points, you can continue to add credit points in future years, including through VET studies and TASC recognised courses.</p> <p>Need to sit an Everyday Adult Standards tests? If you need to meet any of the three TCE Everyday Adult Standards, you can sit a Safety Net Test to achieve the Standard.</p>
<p>Why didn't I receive an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)?</p>	<p>To be eligible to receive an ATAR in Tasmania, you must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • complete two years of post-Year 10 study • meet the Standards to achieve the TCE • achieve at least a Satisfactory Achievement or better in at least four TASC Level 3 or Level 4 courses or equivalent (75 TCE credit points). At least three of these courses (45 TCE credit points) must be achieved in your final year (Year 12 or Year 13). <p>If you believe you should have received an ATAR but haven't, please contact us using the Results Queries form.</p>
<p>Can I update my Qualifications Certificate after I finish school?</p>	<p>Yes. Your Qualifications Certificate can be updated as you gain more qualifications throughout your life.</p> <p>If you complete an Everyday Adult Standards Test/s (to meet the Standards to achieve your TCE), your Qualifications Certificate will be re-issued.</p> <p>See Qualifications and certificates for more information.</p>
