INTERNAL RATINGS

Level 3 and Level 4 – verification period is now open

- Reminder that all **corrections** must be made by the teacher in TRACS (independent and Catholic schools) or SARIS (DoE schools)
- Verification period closes Wednesday 18 November.

Level 1, 2 and Preliminary Courses

- Level 1, 2 and Preliminary internal ratings are due to TASC by COB Thursday 19
 November
- Internal ratings verification period for Level 1, 2 and Preliminary courses Monday 23 Friday 27 November.



TASC 2020 Medical Certificates

- Please remind students and parents that the <u>TASC Medical Certificate</u> is the only is the only medical certificate accepted by TASC and must be used by students if they are unable to attend an exam due to illness or emergency.
- What to do in case of illness and emergency during the examination period
- TASC will accept medical certificates if a student is unable to attend an exam due to undertaking a COVID-19 test.
- An email will be provided to the student's registered email address confirming that the medical certificate is accepted (following review of the application).



TASC 2020 Medical Certificates

COVID-19 TEST - MEDICAL CERTIFICATES

- Follow advice from <u>Public Health</u>
- Submit the <u>TASC Medical Certificate</u> to TASC
- Isolate until results of the test are received
- Students are not expected to sit a schedule exam on the day of receiving their results
- Students are expected at exams scheduled from the day after receipt of a negative test
- If a student is still unwell and unable to sit scheduled exams they should make an appointment with a GP and have the GP submit an additional TASC Medical Certifiacte

The Preliminary Achievement Guarantee:

- is designed to support students who are finding their courses particularly challenging
- applies to courses with external assessments where students are expected to demonstrate their knowledge and skills under pressure in a time critical environment, such as written exams, oral exams, performances and presentations
- applies to students who sit their exams, and are 'tracking towards' at least a PA.

PRELIMINARY ACHIEVEMENT **GUARANTEE FOR 2020**

Schools and TASC have been working together to keep end-of-year external assessments on track for 2020 and to provide current Year II and 12 students with the support needed to ensure they are not further disadvantaged as a result of the challenges COVID-19 has presented them with this

We have introduced the Preliminary Achievement Guarantee for students who are not on track to achieve a result of Satisfactory Achievement (or higher) in TASC accredited courses.

What is the Preliminary Achievement Guarantee for 2020?

- The Preliminary Achievement (PA) Guarantee is designed to support students who are finding their courses challenging after a disruptive year of study due to the pandemic
- For those Year 11 and 12 students who are tracking towards Preliminary Achievement (partial attainment of the course objectives/criteria) they will receive at least a PA if they sit their end-of-year exam (including written, oral, performance or presentation external
- This PA Guarantee means that these students are guaranteed to not go backwards (they won't be awarded a lower result) if they sit their exam, and it provides encouragement to
- By sitting their exams students are giving themselves the opportunity to fully demonstrate their knowledge, and they may possibly do even better than a PA.
- It is a way to support students during what has been a challeng

The PA Guarantee does not:

- apply to assessments where students prepare their external assessment work throughout the year, with support from their school
- guarantee students an award of Satisfactory Achievement or higher
- apply to Level 1 or Level 2 courses
- need to be applied if a student achieves a PA on their own.

COVID-19 Safe planning – 2020 End of Year Assessments

- TASC is required to maintain attendance records for all attendees in exam and assessment centres.
- Digital attendance records will be maintained by TASC supervisors and Marking Coordinators for TASC sessional employees.
- Level 3 and 4 students student phone numbers must be updated in the relevant systems (TRACS or Edupoint).
 Schools please cross-reference data to ensure there is a phone number for all students completing an external assessment.
 Encourage all students to register an email address.



EXAM CENTRE – ATTENDANCE

Students attending an exam centre that is not their home school:

- must arrive at the exam centre 20 minutes prior to their scheduled examination time
- must report to the Main Administration Office to complete any required documentation (i.e. health screen form)
- must follow all instructions from the hosting school/exam centre.

TASC is contacting schools whose students are being hosted by exam centres to outline possible COVID-19 related processes.

TASC will provide a report to exam centres providing schools and students who will be hosted.



RELEASE OF TASC EXAMINATION PAPERS

- Physical exam papers will be released by TASC Exam Supervisors on the end of the last day of the exam period in 2020.
- TASC will publish materials relating to each exam by close of business on the day the last candidate has completed their exam.
- This important change is due to a examination clash resolutions and some Reasonable Adjustments.

At this stage, external assessments are scheduled to go ahead with COVID-safe practices in place, in line with the published

Safety measures won't change how you experience your exams and assessments, however, it's important to consider the information below.

WHAT DO I DO WHEN I ARRIVE AT MY EXAM?

You will need to follow the instructions given by Exam Supervisors, the signage at Exam Centres and bring the personal supplies needed to complete the exam.

IS MY EXAM CENTRE COVID-SAFE

TASC is working with your school / Exam Centre to ensure that additional COVID-safe hygiene hygiene stations with hand sanitiser set up outside exam rooms

- signage reminding you about COVID-safe practices and behaviours
- physical distancing of desks for written exams in line with usual practice
- cleaning of shared equipment such as desks and chairs, and high touch points in exam rooms encouraging fresh airflow in exam rooms where possible, as long as this doesn't create noise

CAN I ATTEND AN EXAM IF I'M UNWELL?

You must not attend an exam if you have any COVID-19 symptoms, or if you are in isolation awaiting a test result. If you attend exams while experiencing cold or flu like symptoms, a senior staff member test result. If you dittend exacts write experiencing cold of the time symptoms, a section sold that it from your school will speak with you about returning home and the steps you need to take.

PAPER BASED SAFETY NET TESTS - 2020

- TASC is waiving the waiting period between safety net tests (for all three TCE Everyday Adult Standards) allowing students who need to re-sit a test without the usual three month waiting period in 2020.

TCE STANDARDS PLANNING FOR FUTURE EDUCATION AND TRAINING STANDARD

- The requirement for planning future education and training standard will be recognised for all students who have transitioned through senior secondary education.
- All Year 12 and 13 students who are currently enrolled with TASC will *automatically* meet the planning for future education and training standard in 2020.
- The Executive Officer is considering the requirement for this standard.



VET RECOGNITION FOR TCE CERTIFICATION

How will VET units and qualifications contribute towards a TCE in 2020?

- All VET units undertaken as part of a full qualification (i.e. a Certificate I, II or III) will be recognised at the level of the qualification, regardless of whether the qualification is completed or not.
- All VET units that are not reported with a qualification will be recognsied at the lowest level the unit is listed in a training package on www.training.gov.au

VET RECOGNITION FOR TCE CERTIFICATION

TASC has been receiving questions about how VET units and qualifications contribute towards a TCE. We are providing further clarity for the process in 2020 and 2021. This information explains:

- how completed VET units are allocated credit points towards a TCE
- the 2020 and 2021 refinements to ensure students undertaking VET qualifications receive

How will VET units contribute towards a TCE?

- All VET units undertaken as part of a full qualification (i.e. a Certificate I, II or III) will be recognised at the level of the qualification, regardless of whether the qualification is completed
- All VET units that are not reported with a qualification will be recognised at the lowest level the

This approach recognises the level of complexity of the qualification in attributing credit points towards the TCE when a student is undertaking a VET qualification. TASC will also ensure that no student undertaking a VET qualification. I.C.s. when a student is undertaking a vel qualification. IASC, will also ensure that no student undertaking a Certificate I in 2020 will be disadvantaged, with their VET units to be recognised at the individual unit level if it is higher than the qualification level.

How is TASC ensuring learners undertaking VET are not disadvantaged by
