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Why have we introduced a new way for students to receive recognition of the Everyday Adult Standard – Use of Computers and the Internet?



- Recognition of in-class achievement against standard
- Transitional arrangement for 2021 through to 2023 as we move towards a Digital Literacy Standard
- Equitable approach for all Tasmanian students



Three ways to receive recognition of the Everyday Adult Standard – *Use of Computers and the Internet*

Gaining a Satisfactory Achievement (or higher) in one of the 16 TASC courses that have the standard included in the course

Having passed the Use of Computers and the Internet Standard safety net test

NEW APPROACH – receiving recognition through the achievement of the other three standards




Introducing the new way to receive recognition of the Everyday Adult Standard – *Use of Computers and the Internet*

Year 12 and 13 students have an additional way they can achieve the TCE Everyday Adult Standard – Use of Computers and the Internet.

At the end of Year 12, students can receive recognition of their use of computers and the internet as part of the achievement of the other three Tasmanian Certificate of Education standards.

Everyday Adult Standard – *Use of Computers and the Internet*



NEW – Receiving recognition of use of computers and the internet as part of the achievement of the other three TCE standards:

- Participation and Achievement Standard – 120 credit points (with at least 80 credit points in studies at Level 2 or higher).
- Everyday Adult Standard: Reading, Writing and Communication (in English)
- Everyday Adult Standard: Mathematics.

How will the recognition occur?



- This new temporary process starts this year and applies until the current Computers and Internet Standard is replaced with a Digital Literacy Standard
- The Principal Declaration will be key to the process of recognition
- Then, where students have met all of the other Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE) standards, student will achieve the Use of Computers and the Internet Standard

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What remains the same?

- The standard of skills and knowledge in computers and the internet has not changed.
- Students can still achieve TCE standards through successful completion of course work.
- Students can still achieve TCE standards via a safety-net test.
- Students who are not progressing towards attaining the three standards can continue to sit safety-net tests.
- Tasmanians who have left school and are working towards attaining the TCE will continue to need to sit a safety net test to show they meet the Computers and Internet standard.





Can a student still obtain this standard via successful completion of course work?

- Yes students can still achieve TCE standards, including the Use of Computers and the Internet Standard through successful completion of course work.



Can a student still obtain this standard via a paper-based safety net test?

- Yes students can still achieve the Everyday Adult – Use of Computers and the Internet Standard via a safety-net test



Can a student still obtain their TCE after they complete Year 12 if they successfully complete a safety net test?

- TASC will continue to accept safety net tests from schools until the start of March of the year following.

How do our students access a safety-net tests?

- You are a testing centre and have or can request paper-based safety net tests for your students
- The student is a dual enrolment and can access a safety net test at their other 'campus'
- Your school is a member of a collective and can contact another neighbouring centre to access testing opportunities
- You can contact TASC via TRACS and register your student/s. TASC will provide student specific support.

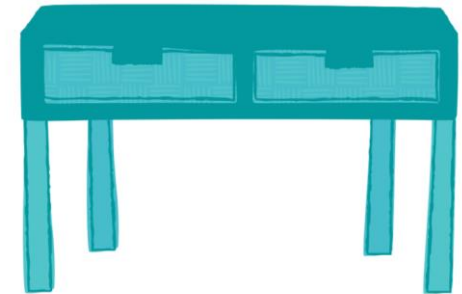
There are three ways to achieve the Use of Computers and the Internet standard:
