

Recruitment Update



Setting Examiners & Exam Critics

- 40 courses with written exams
 - 41 Setting Examiners employed 0 positions left to fill.
 - 79 Exam Critics employed 2 positions left to fill.

Marking Coordinators & Markers

- 53 courses
 - 68 Marking Coordinators employed 3 positions left to fill.
 - Marker applications open (estimated marking loads not yet calculated).

Supervisor Coordinators & Supervisors

- Often have trouble filling these roles and always looking for more supervisors.
- Applications open 17 June.
 - Supervisor Coordinator applications close 26 July.
 - Supervisor applications close 30 August.




(EASAP)

Every year the External Assessment Specifications Advisory Panel (EASAP) meets at the end of March to review the external assessment specifications for courses where amendments had been recommended.

- This year some amendments were made, and these were advertised in the TASC Update and published on the website (see link to the right). Course document webpages were also updated.
- EAS for courses first taught in 2024 will be reviewed at the 2025 EASAP.
- It's important that teachers are familiar with any changes relevant to courses they teach so that they can prepare their students for external assessment effectively.










Things to remember:

- When submitting Reasonable Adjustment applications in TRACS, create a separate application task for each student.
- RA information is confidential, so it's important that multiple students are not linked to one task. Application forms for multiple students shouldn't be attached to a single task for the same reason.
- Use a student task to submit the application. See the steps below for how to create a student Reasonable Adjustments Application task:


Tip

Remember to check that the Principal has signed the application before attaching it to the task.









Exam Attendance



A reminder that this year's written exam period is from **Monday I I November to Thursday 2 I November 2024** and students are expected to be ready to attend their scheduled Level 3 and 4 exams.

If a student is planning to travel interstate or overseas at the time of the exams, the school needs to assist them to request a special exam centre. They must apply before **I July** and be prepared to cover the cost of a special exam centre.

If you have a question about the requirements and applications for special exam centres, contact Assessment using a 'Special Exam Centre' TRACS task.

Derived exam ratings are restricted to students experiencing unfortunate and unplanned circumstances, such as being sick, an emergency or other exceptional unexpected circumstances.


What if a Student is Selected for a Special Event?

- TASC has clarified the evidence that needs to be submitted when a student is unexpectedly selected to take part in a recognised National or International sporting, academic or cultural event that will occur at the same time as their exam.
- This includes that a National or International event is officially sanctioned and has a limited entry basis where a restricted number of young people represent the State of Tasmania, nation of Australia, or a specific cultural group.
- Students must apply for a <u>special exam centre</u> if their travel and/or recognised National or International sporting, academic or cultural event attendance is likely to overlap with the two-week written exam period, and the date of their selection for the event is before I July (the closing date for special exam centre applications).





TRACS Staff Roles



It's important to keep your school's staff role information in TRACS up to date so that TASC knows who to contact. This helps to resolve matters efficiently and supports student privacy.

The approach to updating staff roles varies per sector:

DECYP Providers

The Principal, school Business Manager, ITS staff members or other MyLogin Officers can update staff roles in MyLogin so they are accurate. For example, if someone is no longer acting as a Principal or TLO for your school, select the person's name (the user) and remove this role. DECYP has a self-help article on MyLogin Identity Management. Changes made in MyLogin will then flow through into TRACS (this may take 24 hours to process).

Catholic / Independent Providers

Any staff member with the relevant level of TRACS access (e.g. TLO, Principal or Principal Delegate roles) can update your school's staff contacts in TRACS:

- Log into the TRACS Portal and navigate to the Provider dropdown.
- Select Contact Info, then navigate to the TASC Contacts tab.
- From this page you can edit staff roles, as well as add and delete contacts.



TCE Everyday Adult Standard – Use of Computers and the Internet

From I July TASC will no longer mark paper-based ICT tests. An on-demand online test will be available for schools to use with students requiring an ICT safety net test.

The development of an on-demand online test will retain the flexibility for schools to provide a test at a time that suits the student, with the online test format to provide a more accurate assessment of a student's ICT abilities.

Most students will **not** need to sit an ICT safety net test, as they will meet this Everyday Adult Standard through a course or the <u>transitional arrangement</u>. Only students who are not on track to achieve the TCE will benefit from sitting and passing the safety net test as it will get them closer to being able to achieve their TCE though further post-senior secondary learning.
